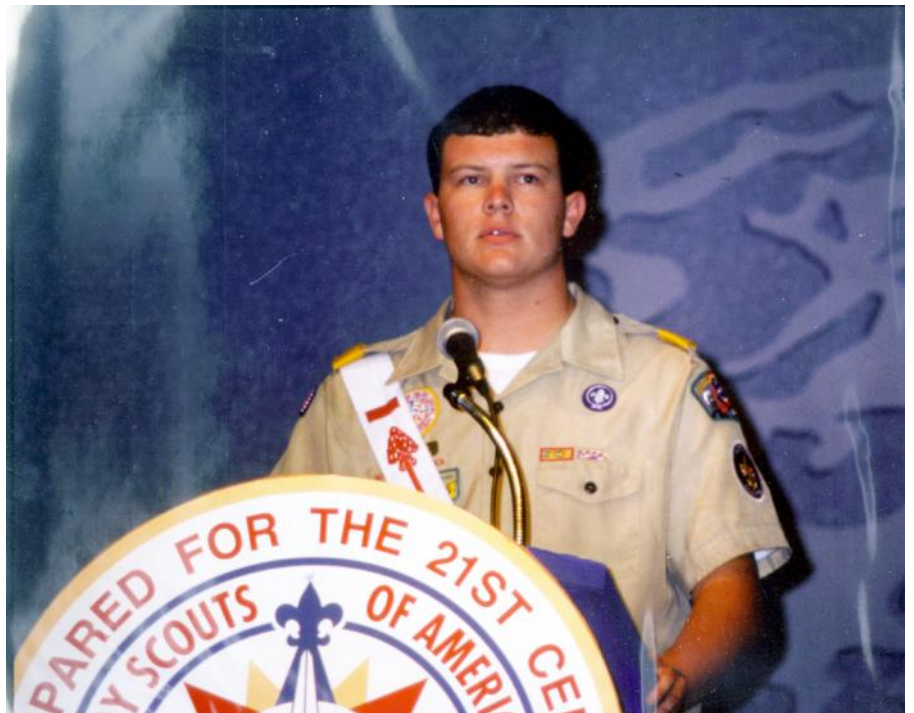

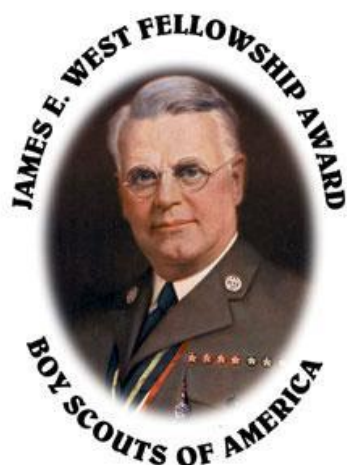

2001 Howard B. Olson*



Howard B. Olson

"For four decades, Mr. Olson was the iconic figure of our lodge. His concern, wisdom and dedication to the Order for so many years have no equal," said former Lodge Adviser Chris Snoddy.

Mr. Olson wore many titles and earned even more awards during his many years of service to Scouting in Middle Tennessee. These awards include the Eagle Scout, Silver Beaver, Silver Antelope, and the OA Distinguished Service Award. In addition to being lodge and section adviser, he was Scoutmaster of Troop 92 in Nashville, Southern Region Area VI Vice president, and a Middle Tennessee Council board member for over 40 years.

"Overcoming great obstacles, Howard, literally showed us how to really walk the walk in a lifelong commitment to mentoring young men to be the best they could be," said former lodge adviser Ray Capp. Even after stepping down from his formal advising positions, he could be seen sitting in training sessions conducted by Arrowmen that he himself had trained, quietly taking notes.

Former Lodge Adviser David Garrett, who served as Lodge Chief while Mr. Olson was Lodge Adviser stated, "He is the reason that Wa-Hi-Nasa Lodge has been a leading lodge in the nation for so many years. He brought a sense of professionalism, a major commitment and determination to help the youth be the best officers they could be. He expected it of us, and he expected it even more of himself. His mentorship to youth, Scouters, and professionals is the secret behind why so many from Middle Tennessee have been recognized on the local, regional and national level."

Howard was known for that distinct, quiet, yet powerful voice asking the profound question: "Got a minute?" After the renovation of the OA lodge, a group of leaders agreed that the building should be named for Howard. He at first refused, but finally agreed after it was pointed out that it could be named in his honor during his life, or it would be named in his memory at a later date. This was yet another example of his humble nature and his dedication to servant leadership.

2001 John Lambrecht*

When Howard Olson was appointed Lodge Adviser, he discovered that the list of lodge members had not been updated, purged or maintained for many years. Realizing how important it was to have an up to date list of dues paying members, both for re-chartering purposes and to get the lodge on a sound financial basis, Howard recruited John Lambrecht to meet this need. This was in the days before home computers and involved punch card systems at his employer, the Corps of Engineers. John, who was noted for not camping, maintained our membership records for over 20 years. He was able to maintain brotherhood conversion statistics, provide chapters list of their active members, and maintained registration for every lodge event. John also was responsible for making many useful suggestions on how to update our Lodge Rules. John Lambrecht was truly a servant leader, one who worked tirelessly behind the scenes to further the purposes of the Order.

John's previous recognitions included: the Vigil Honor, the Founder's Award, the James E. West Fellowship, the District Award of Merit, the Silver Beaver, and the Allogagon Award.

2001 Morris Smiley*



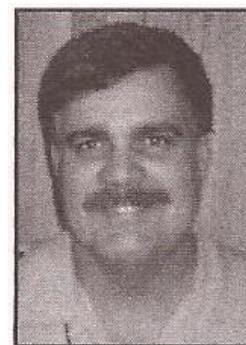
Morris Smiley

In 1975 Morris Smiley was nominated to become a member of the Order of the Arrow. He attended his first conclave that year. Morris later became the adviser to the kitchen for our Lodge in 1977 and held the position for approximately 22 years. This is where Morris truly exemplified that point of the Scout Law: A Scout is Thrifty. It is no secret that the largest part of an event fee goes directly to food. For over two (2) decades, Morris led a team that not only fed people well at OA events, but one that was always under budget. Much of this was based on the concept of buying in bulk and creating a good tasting meal around that ingredient. One of the most infamous stories about Morris is how he incorporated rice into EVERY meal at a Conclave. Morris is truly a legend in our Council for his ability to lead a team to cook quality meals for the masses, for the least money possible.

Later in his Scouting career, Morris was well known for his cooking demonstrations, his firearms, and/or pocket knives displays. Morris has served Scouting in many ways, from Scoutmaster of Troop 151 for 30 years, Assistant Scoutmaster and, Troop Committee Chairman. Brownsea and Wood Badge staff for many years and the council NESA Committee. Morris has truly been an example of cheerful service over a long period of time. Morris has received many awards over the years: Eagle Scout; Religious Award; James E. West; George Meany Award; Scouter's Key; NESA's Silver Wreath, Scouter's Training Award; Doctorate for the University of Scouting; the Long Riffle; Silver Beaver; and the Founders Award.

2002 David Conant*

David Conant, Sr. a member of Black Fox Chapter, served for many years in the kitchen at lodge events. He assisted Morris Smiley, long-time cook, with the planning and cooking at our lodge events. His wife, Marilyn, also served in the kitchen and received the James E. West award for her service. During these years, the lodge's event budgets were very tight. The average incomes of our Arrowmen's parents were substantially lower than today, and it was important that we offered great food, but at the lowest price possible. This was also in the days before pre-packaged, pre-cooked food. Working hand in hand with Morris Smiley, our longtime cook, David and Marilyn made sure we fed the masses while keeping the lodge in the black.

Chris Snoddy has been a mainstay of the lodge since first becoming an Arrowman as a youth in 1974. He has served as a Lodge Officer, Section Chief, Lodge Adviser, and most recently a counselor and mentor to many of his successors as Lodge Adviser. Chris has always been the adviser that is chosen to tackle the hardest event or the event in the biggest need of detailed planning. He has served as the Wa-Hi-Nasa conclave service adviser for a record 6 conclaves. Chris has been given the title of "Defender of the Lodge" due to a wild story involving no less than NOAC security.

Chris, along with David Garrett and Howard Olson saw the how much national events especially NOAC can positively affect youth in our lodge, to not only strengthen the youth but also the Lodge. He helped raise initial money to fund the Calvin Hughes Fund, and he has served for many years as a trustee. The interest generated by this endowment has paid for countless youth to attend NOAC, become energized then come back and create a better Wa-Hi-Nasa.

Chris's previous recognitions include: the Vigil Honor, the first adult recipient of the Founder's Award in the lodge, the James E. West Fellowship, the Silver Beaver, the Flying Eagle Award, the Allogagon Award, the Josh Sain Memorial Award, the OA Legacy Fellowship, and the section's service award (the Silver Turtle).

2008 Ray Capp

Ray Capp was very active as a youth in the Order in Sipp-O #377 Lodge in Ohio from the time of his induction in 1965. This is where he received his Vigil and began the journey to where he is today. When his son, Clay joined the Wa-Hi-Nasa lodge, Ray stepped up and asked the question that most of us have asked “what can I do to help?” Ray’s first big claim to fame was a Pig Roast at the Fall Fellowship with Brad Goodman as his youth. Later as Lodge Adviser, Ray relied on one of his greatest talents: coming up with a vision, recruiting others and empowering them to help make the vision come to life. Under his leadership, the Lodge continued to thrive, both locally and with national recognition. Both of Ray’s sons, Clay and Peter, have served the lodge as officers, and as section chiefs, and Clay as National Chief.

Ray was later appointed to service on the national OA Committee, serving as a member, as a Vice Chairman, and then as Chairman. As Chairman, Ray is overseeing the planning and celebration of the Order’s 100th Anniversary along with establishing a vision of the OA’s role during our next 100 years of service.

When asked, Ray will tell you that the greatest position he has ever served as was as Scoutmaster of Troop 221.

Ray’s previous recognitions include: Eagle Scout, the Vigil Honor from his lodge as a youth, the Hornaday Medal, the Founder’s Award, the OA’s Legacy Fellowship, the Flying Eagle Award, the Josh Sain Memorial Award, the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award, the OA’s Distinguished Service Award, and the Silver Trifecta (Beaver, Antelope, and Buffalo).

David Garrett has served our lodge and the order in many ways over the years since his induction in 1975. As a youth, he served as lodge vice chief, lodge chief, and then Section Chief for two terms. As an adult member of our Order, he went on to serve as a Lodge Adviser and Section Adviser. Though these titles are impressive, where David has distinguished himself is his continued service, whether or not he has an official title. David was the first person to appoint adult Advisers for each of the lodge officers, thus allowing the youth to learn and grow in their leadership abilities. He has served the lodge as a constant source of information and encouragement to the lodge leadership. Following the death of a chapter member in a car wreck, David, along with Chris Snoddy and Howard Olson established the Calvin Hughes Endowment Fund. They raised money and then invested it, so the interest could be used to assist youth Arrowmen to attend NOAC who could not afford to attend otherwise.

David worked hard with Hershel Tolbert and later Ken Connelly to develop a close working relationship between the Wa-Hi-Nasa Lodge and the Middle Tennessee Council, and while serving as Vice President for Camping, recruited numerous Arrowmen to help plan and run a Council Jamboree at Boxwell. David has since served the Order on the National Order of the Arrow Committee and as a Vice Chairman of Training. One of the first things Craig took on was creating a Lodge Planbook, a resource that detailed Lodge program that year. That was the forerunner for the New Member Guide and LEC Handbook. He then took on lodge communications, helping to build the Wa-Hi-Nasa Lodge into the publications (Flying Eagle, Where to go camping Guide, Planbook) powerhouse that is a staple and point of pride for our Lodge.

Craig's adult career in the OA has been even more meritorious. He has served as Committee Adviser, Lodge Associate Adviser, Lodge Adviser, Section Adviser, National OA Committee member, and National OA Committee Vice Chair. He started out in the lodge by championing the new concept of the lodge having its own website, working to design and implement for the first time. Then even further using technology to bolster our lodge by implementing the communication resource Slack for LEC communications. Using these skills that were learned in the lodge, Craig rose to national level working as editor and adviser for the National OA Bulletin before going on to become the National OA committee Vice Chair of Communications and Technology, responsible for all OA printed material including the last major revision of the OA Handbook.

Craig's previous recognition includes: Eagle Scout, Vigil Honor (name translates to News Writer), Founder's Award, OA's Legacy Fellowship, Flying Eagle Award, Josh Sain Memorial Award, Section E3 Service Award (Silver Turtle), OA 100th Anniversary Centurian Award, OA's Distinguished Service Award, and was recognized for his efforts as the youngest Silver Beaver recipient in Middle Tennessee Council history at the time.

E. Urner Goodman Camping Award



The E. Urner Goodman Award was established in 1969 as a tribute and testimonial to the Order's founder, E. Urner Goodman. Its purpose is to encourage and challenge Order of the Arrow members and lodges to increase their effectiveness in promoting and increasing Scout camping in each council. Awards are presented to two outstanding lodges in each region annually. Our lodge was recognized for their service in **2010** as one of the two lodges in the Southern Region. Then the lodge was again recognized for their service in **2013** with a second E Urner Goodman Camping Award.

Whitney M. Young Jr. Service Award

The Whitney M. Young Jr. Service Award recognizes outstanding service by an adult or an organization for demonstrated involvement in the development and implementation of Scouting opportunities for youth from rural or low-income urban backgrounds. The Wa-Hi-Nasa lodge was also the first lodge in the Nation to be recognized with the Whitney M. Young Jr. Service Award in **2010**. This was presented to our lodge based on our dedication to provide not only the Order's program but Scouting's program no matter what socioeconomic class an Arrowman is raised within.

President's Volunteer Service Award



The President's Council on Service and Civic Participation was established in 2003 to recognize the valuable contributions volunteers are making in our communities and encourage more people to serve. The council created the President's Volunteer Service Award program as a way to thank and honor Americans who, by their demonstrated commitment and example, inspire others to engage in volunteer service. The Gold Level (Highest Award for a 12 month period) is based on the age of the recipient. Young Adults: 250 hours or more, Adults: 500 hours or more and Groups: 1000 hours or more. The Wa-Hi-Nasa Lodge in **2009** was recognized with the Gold Level of this Award. Over the years several individuals, both youth and adults have been awarded the Gold level of this Award also.



Second Century Society



In 1994, when the James E West Fellowship was introduced there were also another higher level of giving designated to make sure those who truly lead were recognized. This level of recognition was that of the 1910 society. When Scouting turned 100 years old in 2010, the 1910 recognition was renamed as a result of looking toward a Second Century of scouting. The lodge supports the Middle Tennessee Council with service projects, man power, and financially through FOS and the endowment. Between 2010 and 2013, the Wa-Hi-Nasa Lodge gave over \$25,000.00 to our council's endowment and were recognized as a member of the Second Century Society.
