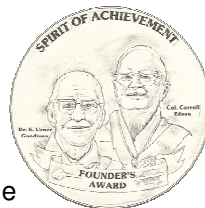

Whitney M. Young, Jr. Service Award

The Wa-Hi-Nasa Lodge is a 2010 recipient of the Whitney M. FE: *What has been your favorite part about being and Arrowman?*

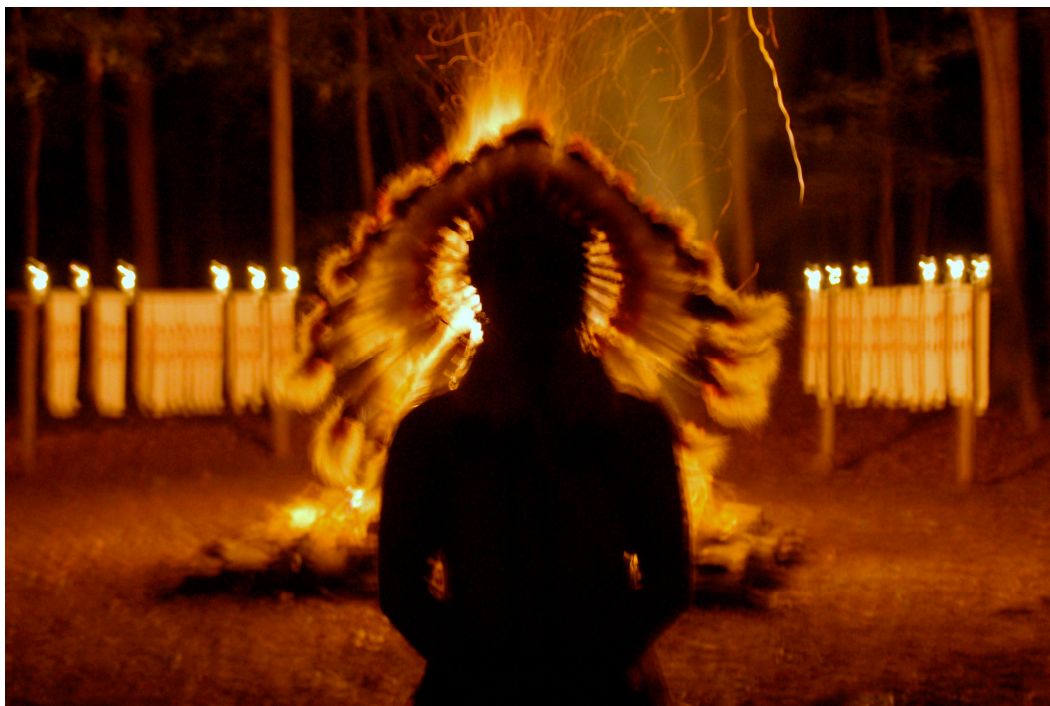
