The National Order of the Arrow Committee recently created the Legacy Fellowship to honor contributions to the National OA Endowment Fund. The



interest from the endowment fund help fund 2011 SummitCorps at the new home of the National Scout Jamboree, OA high adventure service programs at Scouting's high adventure bases, scholarships, and training initiatives like the National Leadership Seminar and National Lodge Adviser Training Seminar.

Modeled on the James E. West Fellowship which recognizes contributions to a local council's endowment, the Legacy Fellowship recognizes a minimum contribution of \$1000 to the National OA Endowment. Like the James E. West Fellowship, individuals and groups may choose to honor other individuals with a Legacy Fellowship by making a donation in their memory or honor.

To ensure support for local council endowment programs, the Legacy Fellowship is only bestowed on individuals who are already James E. West Fellows.

Since 1994, Wa-Hi-Nasa Lodge honored our members who have performed substantial service to Scouting and the Order over many years by making a contribution to the Middle Tennessee Council's endowment fund in their name and presenting them with the James E. West Fellowship.
