## **Q & A**

#### Q: When should I wear my sash?

A: Simply put, an Order of the Arrow sash should be worn while at an Order of the Arrow function or while representing the Order of the Arrow. Your sash should not be worn to normal troop meetings, a camp-o-ree, etc. unless you are doing something like holding troop elections or performing a call out ceremony.

## Q: What do the different OA Pocket Flaps mean?

A: Some flaps are collector's items like NOAC flaps, anniversary flaps, etc. However, there is a standard flap, which is shown to the right. A white border indicates that someone is an Ordeal Member, a red border indicates a brotherhood member, and a gold border means that someone has been inducted into the Vigil Honor. We are unique among the other OA lodges across the nation, because we have different colored flap borders that indicate membership.

### Q: How do I progress my membership in the Order of the Arrow?

A: The OA doesn't have ranks like a troop, but we have levels of membership. The 3 levels of membership are Ordeal, Brotherhood, and Vigil.

You just became an Ordeal Member, after 10 months, you can go through a brotherhood review, and if you are successful, you can become a brotherhood member.

### Q: What is an "OA Rep"?

A: An Order of the Arrow Representative, or OA Rep, is a youth member of your troop that informs you and the rest of your troop about things like chapter meetings, upcoming events, etc. The OA Rep position is a youth leadership position like librarian or scribe.
