



This year's theme is "A year in the life of the Lodge"

Mark your calendars for March 6-8, 2015 for this fantastic event. From now through February 27, 2015 the cost is \$36. After this date, the cost goes up to \$41. What do you get for this bargain price? You get to stay at Latimer Reservation, cafeteria style meals in the new dining hall, games, fellowship, and much more for the whole weekend. This year, we will continue to offer more fun with your quality training. The weekend will feature shooting and mountain biking afternoon, a leadership and learning movie Saturday night, and a very special keynote guest.

This year, OAU training sessions will focused on one of

Hello brothers. With some exciting events like OAU and Conclave on the horizon, I wanted to take the time to talk to you about the importance of training. Part of the purpose of the Order is to:

"Develop leaders with the willingness, character, spirit and ability to advance the activities of their units, our Brotherhood, Scouting, and Ultimately our Nation."

What does this mean? Essentially, one of the jobs of the Order is to train the leadership within the BSA. It is our responsibility as members to bring what we learn in the Order

back to our troops and everyday life.

This training comes in many forms, and is present in every aspect of the Order. The most obvious form of this training is in dedicated training events like our Lodge's upcoming Order of the Arrow University, the Section Conclave, the Region's National Leadership Seminar, and the National Order of the Arrow Conference. All of these events are partially or fully dedicated to training of various forms, and it is highly important for members to take advantage of these events as much as possible. Not only can they offer formal guidance on "best practices," but one becomes exposed to ideas from outside of your troop, or even our Lodge. Tell me if this scenario sounds familiar: You've been in your troop for years, and nothing has ever changed. The meetings are boring and the events are simplistic and uninspired. The youth leadership either does not want to change, or is not confident enough to try new things. This is where the OA comes in.

The problem is that the program in this troop has been recycled and inbred to the point of staleness, and this problem also happens on a Chapter and Lodge level. One of the great things that OA can offer is the chance to hear the practices of other Arrowmen. This strengthens your troop, and ultimately strengthens the BSA as a whole. Training is vital to the growth and development of the program as a whole. Take what you learn seriously, but remember:

- \$17 (for brotherhood, not dues)

## **Unit Elections**

It is time for our chapters to visit every troop in the district and conduct unit elections. This is the way for troops to recognize outstanding members of their troop and for us to obtain new members and introduce them to our Brotherhood of Cheerful Service.

It is essential that the OA bring in new Ordeal members to keep up the momentum of our chapters and the lodge. Therefore, this job falls to both the troops and members of the OA to make sure that every troop schedules an election date with the Chapter so that an election team can visit each troop and conduct the election appropriately.

The updated 2015 unit election forms will soon be available on the lodge website: http://www.wa-hi-nasa.org/. The Lodge encourages troops to announce the Scouts who have been elected either directly following the election, or at the follow troop meeting. This announce-ment should be done without waiting on a public calling out ceremony. This allows our candidates immediate recognition in their troop and allows them to put the Spring Ordeal on their calendar.

With a solid election team following the correct procedure, the Lodge's future can be secured. The key for maintaining membership is also for members of the Chapter and Troop to follow up with the scouts who are elected and make sure that they sign up for the Spring Ordeal and share with them the benefits of OA membership.
