Chapter Shields

This project began last year under Lodge Chief Matthew Murrell. He was supportive of the idea of the project. Ren Worthington supplied all the pieces of wood for the shield. He was a huge help.

The idea was to help every chapter establish or enhance their own sense of identity. Careful thought was put into each of the 16 designs. Some chapters had their own symbols and iconography that went back decades. Other chapters had no visual record, so it was created from the translation of their name or the perceived traits and character of that chapter.

Arrowmen offered a lot of positive feedback. That was a great reminder of why you were doing it and that someone cared. It was an awesome feeling to see people smile or respond on social media. Ultimately, this was kind of a love letter to the lodge and its members.

Each shield is made to last and is property of the lodge. They will be used at lodge events.

Several ideas have been discussed on how to use and display them and build esprit de corps. It took about 7 Months to create all 16.

Some examples - Echota Chapter has a drum to symbolize their nationally awarded drum team from years ago. Witschindin's shield is a modern reboot of a patch they made in the 1970s. Elk River asked that their shield reflect the colors of Sun Drop, a life-sustaining beverage in that district. So, yes, we had some fun with these, but took each one very seriously.



Vigil Honor Nominations

The Vigil Honor is bestowed upon members who show excellence in service towards the lodge, council, and Scouting in general. Preference is given for service performed as a youth member of the Order, although both youth and adults may be recognized with the Vigil Honor. Eligible nominees must be registered, active members of the lodge who have continued in service to others for a minimum of two years from the date of their Brotherhood ceremony.
